



FdA Sport Studies Additional Costs

This document highlights the costs that students may have to meet in addition to their course fees and normal travel costs to attend lessons:

Practical Sports Kit:

Students are not required to wear or purchase college-branded practical sports clothing, however, they are required to wear appropriate clothing for practical sessions at their own expense e.g. trainers, shorts, t-shirt, tracksuit.

Work-Based Learning:

All students are required to work within the sports (or-related) industry on a voluntary or non-voluntary basis as part of Work-Based Learning modules. This should equate to approximately 80 hours in year 1 and 160 hours in year 2. Students are required to choose their own placement of work (which may be their current job), and any expenses required for travel or otherwise are students' responsibility.

Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) Check:

Student DBS checks are not required by the college, but as students are required to work within the sports (or-related) industry on a voluntary or non-voluntary basis as part of Work-Based Learning modules, they may be required to gain a DBS check by the industry organisation. Some organisations will process this at no cost to the student, whilst others will require the student to pay for this themselves. If students wish to, they may pay for a DBS check through North West Kent College at a cost of £44.00.
