TITLE: Construction Youth Trust and North Kent College collaborate to support students remotely to gain construction qualifications

CONTENT: 26 construction students from North Kent College are taking part in an innovative online course delivered by Construction Youth Trust to complement their college learning by gaining industry recognised qualifications.

For young people aspiring to construction trade careers, an essential stepping stone on their employment journey is attaining a Level 1 Health & Safety in a Construction Environment qualification and their CSCS card.

In the current COVID-19 climate, it is more important than ever to ensure young people are fully equipped with the necessary skills and qualifications to make a successful transition from education to the working world. With the support of Construction Youth Trust, North Kent College are taking steps to ensure that their students have the best possible chance to achieve their career aspirations.

Not only will our students gain their qualifications in carpentry or painting and decorating, but the CYT's National Lottery Funded programme gives them a Level 1 qualification in Health and Safety, and crucially their CSCS Card which allows them to start work on construction sites. Ordinarily students would have to pay to sit their CSCS Card qualification and exam and at a time when 16-24 years old have been hit harder by Covid-19 than any other age group in terms of employment, this extra help from the Construction Youth Trust is invaluable for our young people."

By delivering the course through a series of live interactive online webinars, the Trust is able to overcome any restrictions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic and ensure that all young people have access to a comprehensive set of online learning resources. Alongside delivering the free course, generously funded by National Lottery Community Fund, the Trust also gifted students with the CITB CSCS revision app and will be arranging CSCS card tests for the students too.

Construction Youth Trust and the college will continue to work closely together to create a beneficial local network connecting students with industry employers through careers networking and employability sessions.
